Integrity: aligning actions with our values and measuring outcomes to continuously improve We reflect on what we do and why we do it. We transparently report on our outcomes.




Empowerment: sharing knowledge and resources to support informed choice and positive change We believe in informed choices and the importance of lived experience to drive positive change



1. Provide a forum for the maintenance of partnerships and development of innovative approaches in the prevention and control of HIV, viral hepatitis and STIs, in WA



Terms of Reference of SHABBVAC

2. Provide input into the development, implementation and evaluation of the WA **Department of Health's** state health plan and policies for HIV, viral hepatitis, and STIs, taking into account matters such as prevention, education, treatment, care, surveillance, research, legal and policy issues, and evaluation



3. Provide policy advice, taking into account the current epidemiology, behavioural surveillance, evaluation and research findings around BBVs and STIs

5. Provide an opportunityfor advocacy for peopleliving with BBVs or at-risk ofSTIs and BBVs


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



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Most Significant Change Presentation




