Health Consumers' Council joins The Great Registration Race for DonateLife Week

Health Consumers' Council has received a 2021 Community Awareness Grant from the Organ and Tissue Authority to undertake a project aimed at empowering Western Australians to increase their knowledge of the benefits of organ and tissue donation and transplantation, to encourage family discussion and know each other's donation decisions, and to register online on the Australian Organ Donor Register.

"We want West Australians to be able to make informed decisions about organ and tissue donation, and that means ensuring they can access the right resources to help them make the decision, register, and have that conversation with their family," said Health Consumers' Council Deputy Director Clare Mullen.

"Our focus is on increasing awareness and encouraging conversation among Aboriginal people and people from Culturally and Linguistically Diverse backgrounds. We look forward to hosting community conversation over the coming months to learn more about what the community already knows about organ and tissue donation, what they'd like to know, and what resources would be most beneficial for them."

Health Consumers' Council is also proudly taking part in The Great Registration Race for DonateLife Week. Throughout July and August, and with a big push during DonateLife Week (Sunday 25 July – Sunday 1 August), we're encouraging everyone to check they're registered.

The more people who sign up as organ and tissue donors – the more lives that can be transformed.

In 2020, 1,270 Australian lives were saved through an organ transplant due to the generosity of 463 deceased organ donors and their families

"However, we know Covid-19 has had a direct impact on organ and tissue donation. In 2020, there was a 16% decrease in Australians registering as donors. This means it's never been more important to register as an organ and tissue donor and to encourage others to join you."

"Even if you think you might already be registered, we encourage you to check during DonateLife Week."
